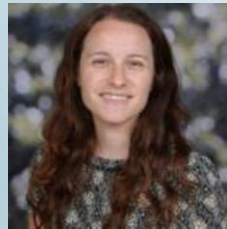

# The Shop ...

Please only send a maximum of £10 in a named wallet/envelope.
